



DAY 1 – ARRIVAL IN NAMIBIA



Arrival at Windhoek International Airport at approx 05h30

After clearing customs, guests are welcomed by their tour guide and local Herero Ladies and escorted to their waiting coaches. Transfer to Hilton Hotel in Windhoek where guests enjoy breakfast and have access to rooms to refresh.

09h30 Transfer to Eros Airport for charter flight to Etosha. (Light aircraft will be used for this size group with a maximum luggage allowance of 15kgs in soft bags. Aircraft will range between 4 and 10 seaters – subject to availability of aircraft)

Once everyone is on board, we take off to Mokuti Lodge. Softdrinks and snack packs will be served on board. Flight time: approx. 1 hour 45 minutes

Upon arrival at Mokuti airstrip, guests are welcomed by African Drummers before a very short transfer to the lodge in open 4 x 4 vehicles.

12h30 A delicious buffet lunch is served on the Tambooti Restaurant terrace before check in.

14h30 We depart for an afternoon game drive in the Etosha National Park

Etosha National Park

The Etosha National Park is one of Africa's great game parks. The park, 'the place of dry water' is one of Africa's best-known parks and is regularly featured on television channels such as National Geographic, Animal Planet and Discovery. From desert to savannah to woodlands, Etosha's landscape is varied and jam-packed with wildlife. It's defining and, at 5000 square kilometres, its largest feature is the Etosha Pan which for most of the year is a bleak expanse of white; shimmering with mirages and the distant shapes of animals seeking the vital water found on the fringes of the pan. The many natural springs scattered throughout Etosha attract a cross section of African wildlife from the diminutive – and endemic Damara Dik Dik to the magnificent elephant. Of the 114 mammal species found in the park, several are rare and endangered, such as the black rhino and black faced impala while big cats such as lion, cheetah and leopard are all present and on the hunt!



PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION AND WORKSHOP WITH A WELL KNOWN WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHER



Taking great wildlife photos is not as easy as it looks. There is a lot of thought and time that goes into producing those great images that we see around us. Not only does one need creativity and technical knowledge but also a knowledge and understanding of subject matter.

A well known Namibian Wildlife Photographer will meet the group after Lunch first day and do a short 15 minute talk on Wildlife Photography and offer a few great tips! He will also tell this a little about the Competition.

In addition to this a local conservation expert will tell the group about Etosha National Park and what makes it special from a conservation perspective and explain what animals can be found there.

During the safari, guests are encouraged to take their best photos. During dinner, he will go from table to table to interact with the group, have a look at their best picture of the day and give them a few tips.

The Photography Workshop aims to reveal more of the thought processes behind the making of good wildlife photographs and at the same time gives photographers time and opportunity to put these thoughts into action in the field under the guidance of an experienced photographer. He will discuss the various elements that would combine to make up a good nature photograph.

After last game drive those that would like to enter the competition submit their best pictures, which will be displayed for the entire group to vote on during the last evening pre dinner drinks. The group and Photographer will select the top 3 images and the winners will be announced after dinner and awarded a prize!

19h30 We meet for dinner at the Lodge Boma

DAY 2 – SAFARI AND OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES



06h00 Breakfast is served at the camp, before departing for an exciting morning of game viewing in the Etosha National Park.

10h30 Guests return to the lodge for breakfast.

Or enjoy one of the following activities;

Option 1: Bushman interaction (max 20 pax) (Additional Group Cost)

Guests enjoy an afternoon of Bushmen interaction. Africa is home to the earth's last hunter/gatherer society, the San Bushmen of the Kalahari. This program gives an inside view of the many cultures of the Bushmen people. The Bushmen is the only ethnic group in Namibia with no traditional area they call home. The dynamic interactive talk is accompanied by fascinating artefacts including traditional dance wear, and jewellery made from ostrich egg, the old known type of manmade beads and much more. There is an opportunity to interact with the Bushmen and share stories in an informal setting.


Option 2: Himba Visit (max 35 pax)

Guests depart on a private charter for Opuwo. Flying time 1,5 hours. On arrival in Opuwo they are transferred to an authentic Himba Village which will not only give you an in depth insight into the life and ways of the last traditional tribe in Namibia, but an amazing photographic opportunity as well. The group will experience the milking ceremony, the smoke bath, be informed on the beliefs around the holy fire, ancestors, and herbal medicine. You will also learn about the jewellery and hairstyles to imitate the status of each tribe member and their close relationship with nature, their cattle and children.

Option 3: Cheetah Conservation Fund (max 35 pax)

Guests depart on a private charter for the CCF located near Otjiwarango. Flying time: 40 mins. On arrival at CCF, the group will enjoy an educational guided tour of the centre where they will view the cheetahs. They can also see the Cheetah runs – where the resident Cheetahs stretch their legs – watch the worlds fastest land animal in action. A picnic lunch can be enjoyed at the camp.



DAY 2 – BBQ DINNER AROUND THE LODGE POOL



Afternoon Game Drive

Guests depart for the great Etosha National Park in open 4x4 vehicles. Stop at various watering holes and watch mud bathing elephants escape the African sun, antelopes quenching their thirst and lazy lions awaken from a day of slumber.

18H00 We return from the evening drive and have time at leisure before meeting on the pool deck for an open air BBQ around the pool.

On arrival at the pool deck, guests are greeted with cocktails and a singing and music performance by the Arts Performance centre

The Project in Oshikuku provides artistic education to more than 230 children across Namibia. The objective is to improve the quality of life of these children through art, especially music. The facilities were built with the donation of the Lenten Foundation and the costs are financed by donors and the sales of items they produce themselves. Experience has shown that if young people make music together, the tribal and gang fights as well as abuse of alcohol and drugs disappear. Their self-esteem and creativity is boosted immensely. The project is deemed as an exemplary development project and has been accredited by the Namibian government.

After the performance, guests enjoy a casual BBQ dinner seated around the hotel pool.

Share your Etosha National Park safari experience with your colleagues around the fireplace. The Bush setting finds its roots in the old African history where it became tradition to sit around a cosy fire and discuss the way of life in the bush.

Help yourself from the open-air grill complete with grilling stations and traditional “potjies” under a large thatched roof. You will enjoy local game specialties from the grill, and rare delicacies like marinated Crocodile and Oryx steaks.

African Entertainment

Dancers and Drummers perform during the evening conveying the spirit of Namibia through song and dance.

Guests are invited to participate in a drumming workshop – a very powerful and stimulating activity.

DAY 4 – ARRIVAL IN SWAKOPMUND, NAMIBIA



Breakfast at the lodge

10h00 Depart and transfer to the airstrip

11h30 We depart on our private charter along the scenic route to Swakopmund. Softdrinks and snack packs will be served on board. Flight time: approx. 1 hour 35 minutes

4 x4 Sandwich Bay Harbour Drive

On arrival in Walvis bay, we board our 4x4 vehicles and transfer to the Walvis Bay Lagoon, where we stop to deflate the 4x4 tyres and receive a briefing from the 4x4 drivers.

You drive along a beautiful dune chain adjacent to the Atlantic Ocean, zigzagging the original railway line between Swakopmund and Walvis Bay. This is an opportunity for a detailed look at the formation of 'the world's oldest desert' - its origins, its composition and its movements. Your first stop is at ' Bird Rock '- a guano island inhabited by about 200 000 birds and one of the first examples of man's efforts to utilize the rich natural resources of the area.

Leaving Walvis Bay behind, you head for the lower reaches of the Kuiseb Delta. This unique ecosystem is dotted with archeological sites, 450 year-old animal tracks, wind blown graves and magnificent dunes. We enjoy some “dune rolling” with our experienced drivers.

Turning south, you begin the approach to Sandwich Harbour. This section of the journey is as dramatic as the landscape, and it soon becomes clear why Sandwich Harbour is often described as inaccessible!

This is the setting for your picnic with platters of savouries, cakes, fruit and drinks.

We depart Sandwich Bay Harbour in 4 X 4 vehicles for Swakopmund. Arrival at the hotel and check in in the early evening.

19h30 We meet in the hotel lobby and walk to the Tug Restaurant – set on the oceans edge and serving delicious fish and seafood.


Location: Uniquely located on the iconic and historic Swakopmund Mole and surrounded on two sides sides by the Southern Atlantic.

Description: The Strand Hotel Swakopmund has been “sculptured” to be more than just a Hotel and is an integral part of the town’s historical centre. It is a beachfront entertainment destination in itself hosting both visitors and locals. Strand Hotel Swakopmund promises guests a warm Namibian welcome and a stay, during which they will be hosted in a relaxed, uncomplicated manner.

Arriving at the Strand is a dramatic experience as one passes through its 13m high and 9m wide Ocean View Atrium which travels right through the Hotel offering sea views at either end. This coastline is home to some 100,000 Cape Fur Seals and the colony at Pelican Point has been known to reach 20,000.

Location: The lodge is situated approximately 330 kilometers south-west of Windhoek on a 44 000 hectare private reserve amidst the Namib Desert. It is located directly adjacent to the entrance gate of the Namib Naukluft Park that is sanctuary to some of the highest dunes in the world's oldest desert.

Air-conditioned and well-appointed with raw iron touches, the spacious guest rooms have a seating area and minibar. Each bathroom includes free toiletries, and is fitted with a double vanity and shower.

DAY 7 – VISIT TO SOSSUSVLEI



Early morning wake up call. We meet in the lodge reception for a cup of coffee before heading out into the Namib-Naukluft Park.

Sossusvlei means the gathering place of water though seldom will you find water here. Instead you'll find the highest sand dunes in the world and perhaps Namibia's most outstanding scenic attraction.

These dunes, part of the Namib Desert, have developed over a period of many millions of years. The result of material flowing from the Orange River dumped into the Atlantic Ocean, carried northward and then returned again to land by the surf. Here the wind continuously shifts the sand further and further inland, reshaping patterns in warm tints that contrast vividly with the dazzling white surface of the large deflationary clay pans at their bases.

The best time to view Sossusvlei is close to sunrise and sunset when the dunes refract spectacular colors, ranging from burnt orange, red and deep mauve. It's a photographer's dream.

We depart the lodge in open 4 x 4 jeeps in time to enter the Namib-Naukluft Park just before sunrise, while the temperature is still mild and when the dune contrasts are at their best.

The more energetic participants now have the opportunity to climb to the upper ridge of one of the scenic dunes in the area. Discarding shoes and plunging bare feet into the hot soft sand is the best way to climb to the top, but each step forms a mini sand slide and footprints look more like an insect trail as they are dwarfed by the sheer size and immensity of the dunes.

We then continue to Deadvlei, a large ghostly expanse of dried white clay punctuated by skeletons of ancient camelthorn trees, carbon dated between 500-600 years old.

Breakfast in the Dunes

After our walk, guests enjoy a simple continental buffet breakfast in the Vlei. Camping style tables and chairs have been prepared and we enjoy a simple buffet of cereals, fresh fruit, yoghurts, cold meats, cheeses and fresh breads with local preserves. Tea, coffee and fruit juices add to the spread.

DAY 7 – DINNER UNDER THE STARS



12h00 Return to the lodge.

Upon arrival back at the lodge, guests enjoy a delicious lunch of fresh salads, bread rolls and a selection of meats and vegetables. The afternoon is free to be spent at leisure. Relax at the swimming pool, enjoy a refreshing drink at the bar or have a siesta!

Before sunset, you will depart on a sundowner drive. Catch the occasional Springbok or the Pale chanted Goshawk as you make your way towards your destination. Enjoy a refreshing drink whilst watching the colours changing over vast desert planes and sand dunes as the sun sets over the backdrop.

Sossusvlei lodge guests will be transferred to Le Mirage

After the sundowners, the vehicles stop at a beautiful setting where the dinner will be served open air in the dry river bed. With the stars forming a canopy overhead, guests gather for a typical Namibian barbecue that brings them tantalisingly near to the mysterious African night.

Guests gather around the huge bonfire and enjoy pre dinner drinks before sitting down at a beautifully laid table for dinner.

The tables are set with all white linen, a stark contrast to the earthy colours at sunset and against the dark backdrops after sunset. With the many candles surrounding the set up and the roof of stars above, the effect is startling.

The cuisine is traditionally African, and main courses offer everything from beef sausages, over Oryx stew to springbok kebabs, accompanied by seasonal vegetables, breads and accompaniments. Lastly, guests indulge in the dessert selection, which consist of some local treats as well as the old favourites.

After dinner your guide will interest the group in the night skies of the Southern Hemisphere with some star gazing.

DAY 8 – HOT AIR BALLOONING & WINDHOEK



OPTIONAL:

After an early morning wake up call, guests transfer for an Hot air ballooning adventure over the dunes.

An unforgettable and most beautiful experience, a balloon safari over the Sossusvlei area is the ultimate treat. The balloons take-off and drift across this magic landscape at sunrise. Often described as “the flight of a life time”, it takes participants over enormous pink and red dunes mixing with granite mountains embedded in yellow and pitch black plains. After a spectacular flight, the pilots host a champagne breakfast at the landing site. Champagne bottles are opened with a sword in a sobrage ceremony and certificates are distributed.

Breakfast at the lodge

10h00 Depart Sossusvlei and transfer to the airstrip

10h45 We depart on our private charter to Windhoek
(Flying time: 1 Hours, 15 minutes)

Arrival at Eros Airport – Windhoek . From here we transfer to Windhoek.

Windhoek is the only proclaimed city in Namibia. It's also the administrative, legislative, and everything else centre of the country. The Namibian capital is situated in the centre of the country and forms a major crossroads to the four ordinal directions. Its population, a meagre 230,000, comprises an impressive mix of Herero, Ovambo, Damara, Kavango, Buster, Nama, San, Afrikaans, and German people all to-ing and fro-ing along streets with African and German names, lined with some decidedly German architecture. As a destination Windhoek cannot compete with the likes of Etosha or Sossusvlei, but the architecture, history, and quirky Afro-Germanic splicing make exploring one of the world's smallest capitals an enjoyable activity.

Arrival at the Hilton Hotel, where guests enjoy lunch at the hotel and time to refresh in their day use rooms

OPTIONAL AFTERNOON VISITS IN WINDHOEK



Optional: Invitation to Katutura Township – Duration 3 Hours

The City of Windhoek has developed Katutura, a district of apartheid in the late 50s. However, before Katutura was created, most black Namibians living in the east of Windhoek in the district now known as Hochland Park.

The Craft Centre Penduka quietly situated near a dam is a combination of poor women, victims of physical disability who refuse fatality. They embroider and create things of incredible quality. We therefore propose a discovery tour of a few hours of this district humanly and historically very rich, to better understand one aspect of reality in Namibia.

The cultural tour begins by crossing the city of Windhoek to continue in the district of Katutura, stopping at places of interest such as the Alte Feste Reiterdenkmal Christus Kirche, Tinten Palast, the old cemetery, visit the craft center Penduka, etc..

Optional: Shopping at the Namcraft Centre – Duration 2 Hours

The Namcraft centre is an outlet for heaps of wonderful Namibian inspiration – leatherwork, basketry, pottery, jewellery, needlework, hand-painted textiles and other material arts – and the artist and origin of each piece is documented.

We depart the hotel around 17h00 and transfer to Hosea Kutako International Airport for our flight to Europe.

Transfer time 45 minutes


