The Third Baptist Church will be hosting a Martin Luther King Holiday Observance in Suffield on Sunday, January 15, 2017 at 4 pm. Third Baptist Church is located at 188 Kent Ave., Suffield. 2017 will be the 25th consecutive year that the Greater Suffield Interfaith Council has supported this community event to observe the birthday of The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This year marks the 88th birthday of Dr. King and the 32nd national holiday in his honor. It is celebrated in over 100 countries around the world.

The day marks the importance of remembering Dr. King's work and legacy, celebrating his birthday as a national holiday, and acting on his teachings and principles of nonviolence and human rights. It is also a day on which community service initiatives are encouraged to take place across the country.

The event will feature the Third Baptist Church Chorus and Suffield's special interracial, interfaith, intergenerational choir. January Communion Offering Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services (I.R.I.S.)

The Communion offering for the month of January is dedicated to supporting the refugee families who have recently settled in Connecticut. Your contributions will be contributed to *Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services* (I.R.I.S.) located in New Haven. The Mission of I.R.I.S. is to help refugees and other displaced people establish new lives, strengthen hope, and contribute to the vitality of Connecticut's communities. IRIS partners with the Federal Government and Connecticut faith communities like us to help fund, settle and support newly arrived refugee families.

It is estimated that sixty million people are displaced globally, the highest number since World War II. At last count, the Syrian conflict alone has left nearly 8 million Syrians internally displaced and nearly 5 million Syrian refugees seeking safety far from their homelands. These numbers are increasing as the conflict in Syria continues. To be admitted to the United States, refugees must demonstrate that they have a well-founded fear of persecution because of their race, religion, nationality, political opinion, or membership in a particular social group, and must undergo rigorous security screenings, including biometric checks and interviews with specialized and well-trained Department of Homeland Security officers.

I.R.I.S. helps refugees who have been resettled in Connecticut by providing them with the tools of selfreliance: housing, job placement and employment skills, English-language classes, and community orientation. Refugees are resilient, responsible, hard-working people who possess the potential to contribute importantly to our communities (creating jobs, starting businesses, opening restaurants, bringing cultural diversity, buying homes, paying taxes, etc.).

The Missions Committee hopes that your contributions (to the January Communion Offering) will help support refugee families as they rebuild their lives here in Connecticut.
