We all know that, in addition to the difficult personal issues we experience, we also face multiple crises as a global community of life; some of these even seem to be "intractable," perhaps beyond the capacity to address in any meaningful manner. But during this season of expectation and hope, there seems to be something "in the air" that opens us up to a sense that something wonderful is coming: the possibility for God's reign to break down the barriers and actually break into this too often weary world. Anxiety and despair may continue to linger but the hope that there is a way that leads to life that is mutually enhancing for all, finds expression in the birth of the Child who is peace and whose Way is love.

There is a poem I always read during the Advent/Christmas season – and I read it often. It was written by Howard Thurman and it causes me to slow down, take a breath and remember that God is still at work in this world and is calling us to work alongside of each other and God for the sake of the world.

I Will Light Candles This Christmas

I will light candles this Christmas: Candles of joy, despite all sadness, Candles of hope where despair keeps watch, Candles of courage for fears ever present, Candles of peace for tempest-tossed days, Candles of grace to ease heavy burdens, Candles of love to inspire all my living, Candles that will burn all the year long.

I hope you have an opportunity to light candles this Advent/Christmas season.

Beat the after Christmas letdown and come to Lego Night at the Church!! Join us on Friday, January 6th at 6 p.m. in the




The Council Of Ministries structure below is a visual of how we hoped communications would flow between the ministries of Second Baptist Church.
