As I write, we are in the beginning of the season of Lent, a season that points us to Holy Week and Easter, to the death and resurrection of Christ. For many, Lent is an

intentional season of re-directing one's life and faith to God and God's purposes. I find that one of the most helpful ways to do this is to practice silence, to "sit" still and be as fully aware of what is happening around and within you. Though I'm a "work in progress," I agree with Joan Chittister who wrote, "Silence is where we must go when we want to be truly spiritual people." It's in the silence where God speaks to the heart. The call is to learn how to keep silent and when to keep silent – it's a "spiritual art."

Silence is not always a good practice, however. Hard and bitter silence refuses to allow someone else the chance to change when they have hurt me; it refuses to allow me to understand the needs of those around me and my own needs, but soft, open silence makes it possible for the other to express his or her desire, gives them a chance to open their heart to me. Receptive silence invites others to express their ideas, share their hopes, their dreams, giving the other dignity and purpose. True silence demands that we attend to what's happening within us, refusing to allow us to ignore the fear or turmoil or pain or bitter feelings that often arise, or to avoid the great questions of life. And there is nothing good that can come of keeping silence in the face of injustice and violence. Silence of that kind only makes us either an accomplice or passive onlooker to another person's trauma or another groups' oppression. To keep silent in the presence of evil is evil, but to speak the truth from the silence one holds is

As we continue to move towards Holy Week and Easter, what kind of silence will you hold? Will it be a gift – to yourself? To others? To the world?

Spirituality of Caring for Creation

Luis Lee, Seneca Artist, member of the Iroquois Six Nations Seneca Beaver Clan, and Suffield resident, and the Reverend Tom Carr, pastor of the Second Baptist

Church of Suffield, will share their reflections in a presentation on the spirituality of caring for creation and each other, on Thursday, March 3rd at 7:00pm at Sacred Heart Church. Sponsored by the Greater Suffield Interfaith Council, this presentation is to remind us that all religions and spiritual traditions have as a central part of their worldviews the understanding that all life is sacred – human and other than human – and that we are called to reverence and the protection of this life for future generations.

Luis was born on the Seneca Nation's Allegany Indian Reservation in Quaker Bridge, New York. His clan name, Guin Yah Geyh, means "Something from the Clouds." He is an artist, creating beadwork jewelry, horn rattle and other handcrafts, and is a former lacrosse player and now coaches high school lacrosse (visit his website at www.luisrlee.com).

Tom is an American Baptist pastor who for 30 years has been active in eco-justice work with individuals and congregations of many different religions, is the founder of the CT based Inter-religious Eco-Justice Network (IREJN), serves on the steering committee of the National Religious Coalition for Creation Care (NRCCC), and co-chairs the American Baptist Creation Justice Network.

Great Courses Bible Study Wednesdays at 9:30 am


