Three thoughts for your reflection. The first is our Comments upcoming 2017 financial stewardship campaign which you'll read about in

another place in this edition of the Crier. Each year, we are called and encouraged to prayerfully and thoughtfully consider what we will give of our financial resources to support the ministries and mission of our congregation. This is really a call that looks in three directions. First, it looks outward, to the hopes and dreams, the vision and mission of our congregation to live in and do the will of God in the world. Secondly, it's a call to reflect inward, to the deep places of our souls, of our experience of the presence of God in our lives and how we might personally respond to the presence of Love with our money, our financial resources. Third, it's a call to look both outward and inward to the God who makes his home in our heart, the One who dwells within us and within all existence, to the movement of the Spirit that is always doing something new, something life-giving, some remarkable work of Love. How will you look, and what will you see through the eyes of your heart as you consider your financial commitment to the ministry of Second Baptist Church?

Secondly, the upcoming election – nationally, statewide and locally. With all the media coverage of these campaigns, the thing that is sorely lacking, in my estimation, is a serious conversation about the moral, ethical and spiritual elements of the candidates' positions and policies. As a Christian and follower of the Way of Jesus, I ask myself whose policies and positions are most closely aligned to the Way of Love embodied by Jesus of Nazareth and the risen Christ of the Universe? Which policies and positions will lead the world to a more just, equitable and peaceful world, the

kingdom of God, the image Jesus uses most frequently? Which policies and positions will enhance the common good for all people and all creation? Which policies and positions will assist "the least of these [Christ's] brothers and sisters"? Which policies and positions will help or hinder individuals and groups of people to come to a deeper kinship with all life, or, in the words of Howard Thurman will assist us in recognizing that "we belong to life and the whole kingdom of life"?

Third. I've just finished reading a book about Meister Eckhart, the 14th century German mystic. He was part of the Dominican order, a teacher, preacher, spiritual director and social critic who was deeply involved in the life of the world of his day. I am coming to think that he is one of the most important "ancient" teachers for us today as followers of Jesus in these changing and often chaotic times. One of his teachings that strikes a deep chord in me is what is known as the Cosmic Christ where "Christ is all in all," to use a phrase from the Apostle Paul. Eckhart was particularly fond of John 1: "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God." In one of his many sermons on this text, Eckhart teaches that "all creatures are words of God" and "the purpose of a word is to reveal." All creatures - human and other than human - are revelations of God like Christ. The word God speaks is continuous, ongoing as creation is and it is spoken and unspoken, for "they all want to speak God." Teachers like Meister Eckhart reveal a God so much bigger than anything I can even imagine. I am grateful.

Commitment Sunday Following the Way of Love
