Growing up in an American Baptist Church in Royal Oak, Michigan, I knew Comments nothing about the season of Lent. Other than Roman Catholic friends who I'd see on a Wednesday in February or March with a smudge mark on their foreheads,

the only thing I was aware during the season were the special services our congregation held on Maundy Thursday (or Holy Thursday), Good Friday and then, of course, the great celebration of Easter. For whatever reason, the church of my childhood didn't embrace the Lenten season as one of preparation, one that invites people to engage in spiritual practices that can help open up one's inner life to discern the movement of God in his or her life. When I went to seminary, I was introduced to the significance of Lent for the spiritual lives of individuals and congregations as a time of focus and intentionality, a time of practice to help us in our relationships with God, ourselves, others and all creation.

During the "40 Days of Lent" leading to the cross and resurrection of Christ (actually, there are 47 days; the 40 doesn't include Sundays), one thing many people engage in is to "give up something." Often people "give up" some type of food or drink; or to give up watching television or going on Facebook. On the flip-side of "giving up something," I have known people who decide to do more physical exercise, read through the Bible, practice daily meditation, join the choir for the season, work in a soup kitchen and other "adding somethings" during the season. Whether giving up or adding something, the purpose is to be intentional about what you do, being more focused in order to walk more intentionally and fully with God.

"Giving up" or adding something in your Lenten journey, can be a helpful way to focus your intention on your spiritual life. During this season of Lent, I encourage you to be intentional about your spiritual practices, your life of prayer. And whatever your practice, remember that God is with you; always.



Award-winning film *Bag It* at the Second Baptist Church

This documentary is the first in a series of free programs on current environmental issues presented by The Second Baptist Church in collaboration with the Kent Memorial Library and the local chapter of the Sierra Club. It will be shown on Sunday, March 17 at 4:30 p.m. at the Fellowship Hall, Second Baptist Church on 100 North Main Street. Bag It follows "everyman" Jeb Berrier as he tries to make sense of our dependence on plastic bags. Although his quest starts out small, Jeb soon learns that plastic waste affects oceans, rivers, and ultimately our health. The consumption of plastic particles can disrupt the endocrine glands, cause cancer, diabetes, autism, attention deficit disorder, obesity, and infertility.

The average American uses about 500 plastic bags each year, for about twelve minutes each. This single-use mentality has led to the formation of a floating island of plastic debris in the Pacific Ocean more than twice the size of Texas. Cities including Washington, DC and San Francisco, as well as some in Ireland, Italy and China have curbed plastic use.
