Each year in October, part of our focus as a congregation is stewardship. We en-Comments gage in our annual financial commitment campaign to support the ministries within our congregation and the mission in our community and throughout the

world. The primary focus is on our financial stewardship, what God is calling us to give in response to the love, grace and blessings in our lives. And that's good. However, stewardship is more than what we do with our money. A more wholistic way of considering stewardship is to see it from the "Three T's": our Time, our Talents and our Treasures.

How do we spend our time in service, to help meet at least some of the many needs of the world God so loves? I understand how busy our lives are these days. It seems as though time is speeding up, that there's "not enough hours in the day," that you can't add another thing to "your plate." The stewardship of one's time is more important today than ever which means that one has to be intentional about creating space in one's life to assess how you spend your days, determining what is good and life-giving for you and others, and how you might use the time given to you for the common good. As part of Second Baptist Church, I hope you will spend time in discernment about your participation for your spiritual growth, for the mission of the church, and for the sake of the larger mission to which God calls us as followers of Christ.

In what ways will we share our talents alongside of others in the ministry of the church? When I say "talents," I'm really talking about "gifts," the gifts of the Spirit that God has given you for your life inside and outside the church. All of us have spiritual gifts, though sometimes we "hide them under a basket." Every gift is essential to build up the church, the Body of Christ, in order that the whole Body may be used by God for the sake of the kingdom "here on Earth as it is in heaven."

How might we respond to the love and grace of God in our lives as we prayerfully determine how much financial treasure will we return to the One who is continually blessing us? For millennia, people of faith have been

trying to determine what percentage of, or how much we give of our financial resources for the maintenance and ministry of the church (a tithe - 10%?). These have been and continue to be responses to what God has done and continues to do in one's life. For those of us in the Baptist tradition, it is an individual (or family) decision based on one's capacity to give and one's commitment to the grace and love of God in one's life.

My purpose in writing these comments is to spark and/ or renew your prayerful reflection as you consider your commitments this year to the ministries of Second Baptist Church by giving your time, your talents and your treasure as you respond to the love and grace of God in your life.

#### A Reflection on Stewardship

The first and most fundamental vocation of human beings is to be a faithful caretaker or steward of life. In the story in the second chapter of Genesis, God sets "the adam (the man) in the garden to tend it and care for" all life, human and other than human. The word "steward" is the English translation of the Greek word oikonomos which literally means "house manager." A steward was the trusted servant who managed the master's estate, someone who was a caretaker of someone else's property. As people of faith, a steward is one who recognizes that God is the creator, master, owner of all life and that we human beings are the servants and caretakers of what is God's; and we are accountable to God for how we care for it all. Life is a gift which can never be possessed; it can only be gladly received from the Giver over and over again, and given back in return for the good of all people and God's precious planet.

During this season of stewardship in the life of our congregation, may we prayerfully consider how we might be good stewards of life – individually and as a community of faith.
