What does it mean to live the Resurrection? Comments By the time this edition of the Crier "goes to print," Easter Sunday

will have come and gone but for followers of Jesus, Easter is more than a once a year remembrance; it is a way of life. And so, the question about living the resurrection faith is one that should be asked daily by those of us who follow the One who called us to both "take up our cross and follow [him]" and "Go into all the world and make disciples of all nations."

With all that's going on in and to the world today, nothing, in my estimation, is more important than how we respond to the call to live the Resurrection. How can we live the new life that God is bringing into the world every day, every moment? How do we be, act and live in the way of the Risen One when so much of the human world continues to crucify life today? The problems are monumental and often so complex that it leads many to denial, cynicism and resignation. But every major change for the good and health of people, nations and Earth itself, begins with small steps, simple steps, starting somewhere with compassionate acts.

To live the Resurrection is to live from hope and to live from hope means that to affect positive change in the world to work for "the kingdom of God that has come near" in the words of Jesus we start somewhere, stepping forward

from the edge of the empty tomb in some way. As Vaclav Havel, the leader of the non-violent revolution in Czechoslovakia in 1989 said, "I stopped waiting for the world to improve and exercised my right to intervene in that world."

The Resurrection of Christ is God's great intervention in the world and we are invited to participate in it. How will you and I live the Resurrection today – as a community of faith?

Mr. Macri will perform two of the most popular compositions written for Rampal: the "Sonata for Flute and Piano" by Francis Poulenc (1899-1963) and the record setting smash hit "Suite for Flute and Jazz Piano" by Claude Bolling (b. 1930).

Timothy Macri will be accompanied by pianist Scott Nicholas and contrabassist Alex Svensen.

Not only were the two compositions written especially for Mr. Rampal but they both were premiered with their respective composers performing as pianists.

This program, presented at 3:00 pm on April 24, promises to be a warm, exuberant beginning to the Spring/Summer concert season.



# The Hot Cat Jazz Band Celebrates Worship on April 10<sup>th</sup> at Second Baptist Church


