As I write, the season of Lent is just around the corner. It is the season of preparation for Easter beginning with Ash Wednesday (which is February 26th). In many respects, Lent is like Advent as it is a time of both being in the moment and looking forward in hope and expectation. It is a time of intentionality about one's prayer and spiritual life, a time for reflection on

one's life and work, a time to commit to changes in the way you may be living to be consistent with the way and will of God. There are 40 days in the Lenten season which recalls the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness after his baptism. However, if you look at the calendar, you'll notice that there are more than 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. This is because Sundays are not included in Lent. As Lent is a time for repentance – and prayer and fasting - every Sunday is a feast day, a day to celebrate the risen Christ.

For many, Lent is a container that helps one intentionally focus on one's relationship with God. It can be a season that calls one to spend time each day, often several times a day, alone in silence, or with a journal or Bible, or outside walking and being a part of "nature." It can be a time of just "being" with the One who seems so elusive in our often frantic days but who is always with us, living within us. For some, Lent becomes a "season of intentionality," a time of renewal in one's commitment to prayer.

Actually, I think poets say it best. The following is by Ann Weems from her book of poetry, "Kneeling in Jerusalem."

"Lent is a time to take the time

to let the power of our faith story take hold of us,
a time to let the events

get up and walk around in us,
a time to intensify

our living unto Christ,
a time to hover over

the thoughts of our hearts,
a time to place our feet in the streets of Jerusalem

or to walk along the sea and listen to his world,
a time to touch his robe

and to feel the healing surge through us,
a time to ponder and a time to wonder . . .

Lent is a time to allow a fresh new taste of God!"



<u>Come, Learn to</u> <u>Assemble a</u> Bluebird House!

On Sunday afternoon, February 23rd at 2:00pm in the Fellowship Hall of Second Baptist Church (100 N. Main St),

Richard Binns will be leading a workshop on assembling Bluebird houses.

Richard is an advocate of the Gilbertson Bluebird house design which is very accommodating to Bluebirds - but not at all to larger European House Sparrows (which can threaten Bluebird populations by occupying and thereby crowding them out of available nesting boxes.) The Gilbertson bird house has a small nesting cavity - large enough for most Bluebirds and small species of birds, but too small for (larger) House Sparrows that don't like the smaller space.

This workshop to assemble Bluebird houses is open to the whole community. It's an opportunity to learn about Bluebirds and the importance of providing suitable shelters that cannot be taken over by non-native European Sparrows.
