I recently read an article about the season of autumn, written by a Mid-westerner who began the essay with the following: "Autumn in

my part of the world is a season of bounty and beauty. It's also a season of steady decline . . . The days become shorter and colder, the trees shed their glory and summer's abundance starts to decay toward winter's death."

As a 26-year resident of New England, I agree with his observation. In addition, I would say that autumn, with all the "falling" that happens, is also a season full of promise. As the leaves fall and plants wither to be composted in the ground, seeds are being planted, preparing for a new life in the spring. Amid all the falling, the "seeds of new life are always being silently and lavishly sown" (Parker Palmer from "On the Brink of Everything").

November is such a season, a time that "nature" both dies and plants seed for new life. The seeds are hidden from our sight and yet, always preparing to rise again. Which is not unlike congregational life – there are always new ministries that are being born and others that die which plants the seeds for other ministries to arise. This is also not unlike our personal lives, new possibilities arising, parts of us dying and new parts of ourselves that we may have never known, being born. That's not easy to accept, I know, because like most, I want to hold on to what has been even when it is time to let go of ways of doing things in order for something new to be born. But the season of autumn is a gift that calls us to consider what is dying in our lives and what "seeds of new life are ...being silently and lavishly sown."

May this autumn season be a time of prayerful reflection on your life and the life of our congregation.

Each individual has a unique vocation, a call of God to live out the gift of being a child of God, created in the "image of God." Whatever that unique vocation of each person, it is part of the singular human vocation of stewardship. To be a steward is to be a trustee, to care for and manage faithfully what has been entrusted to us. In the life of faith, that stewardship is about caring for the life that God creates for the sake of all life, human and other-than-human. In the Christian faith, we proclaim that "all life is God's," as the Psalmist sings, and "everything in it; the world and those who live in it." That includes how we manage and use the financial resources entrusted to us and how we use the time and the talents with which we have been blessed. As this year's Commitment Campaign theme scripture puts it, we are to "serve one another with whatever gift each has received," for building up God's kingdom, "here on Earth as it is in heaven." God calls each one of us to faithful stewardship in all areas of our life. How to respond with our Time, Talents and Treasures, is the question for each one of us to prayerfully consider for the sake of our own spiritual growth, to serve one another in love and for the world that God so loves.


SBC Thanksgiving Dinner Saturday, November 17th at 4 pm

November Communion Offering Suffield Community Aid

During November our Communion Offering will be designated to the local Fuel Bank which is part of the Fuel Assistance program at the Suffield Community Aid (SCA) organization, formerly called the Emergency Aid Association.

The Fuel Assistance program is a financial support program at the SCA and is one of many support programs offered there. The SCA coordinates several fuel programs, including the State's Energy Assistance Program, the non-profit organization Operation Fuel, as well as the local Fuel Bank funded by private resources and an allocation for fuel from SCA's General Budget.

SCA helps town residents complete applications and advocates for fuel requests to the State's Energy Assistance Program and Operation Fuel, both of which have different eligibility requirements and both are encouraged to be used as a first priority. SCA also disburses funds from the local Fuel Bank to provide fuel deliveries to those not qualifying for programs like those listed above or where the need is critical in an emergency, in addition to providing financial assistance for other fuel type requests. During fiscal year 2017-2018, these programs in total provided \$148,850 in fuel aid to 239 residents of which the local SCA Fuel Bank provided \$9,965 of the total. As we approach the cold winter months, we all appreciate the warmth that we enjoy in our homes and often take it for granted that we can afford heating our homes. Many in Suffield cannot afford paying for heat and donating to the local Fuel Bank helps support those in our community. Please prayerfully consider providing financial support to the SCA Fuel Assistance Program for our neighbors needing fuel assistance to warm their homes this winter. Thank you.
