al in nature, others with only a "hint" of theology. Here's my summer reading list.

"The Secret Wisdom of Nature: Trees, Animals, and the Extraordinary Balance of All Living Things," by Peter Wohlleben. Wohlleben is a scientist, a forester from Germany who wrote another book I love, "The Hidden Life of Trees." "The Secret Wisdom of Nature," expands his earlier observations and shows how the natural systems make life on Earth possible through the interplay between animals and plants and how they influence, support and communicate with each other. He's a great story-teller, rooted in scientific observation and studies, particularly from the regions of central Europe and North America.

"An Invisible Thread," by Laura Schroff and Alex Tresniowski, is a true story of an eleven year-old homeless child in New York City, a sales executive and their meeting and deep relationship that becomes a lifechanging experience for both of them over decades. This was highly recommended by a friend.


"Climate Church, Climate World: How People of Faith Must Work for Change," by Dr. Jim Antal. Jim is a friend, recently retired UCC clergyperson and long-time advocate for the church to be active in the work of environmental justice, particularly climate change.

"Silence: The Mystery of Wholeness," by Robert Sardello. Sardello is a psychologist and teacher who deals particularly with spiritual psychology. His focus in this book is on the power of silence that can move us to let go of the clatter and chatter of our minds in order to feel the presence of the Holy, God.

I hope you find time this summer, and any time, to read books that entertain, encourage, make you think and challenge you.

Newest Nonprofit in Town Will Change Lives

Suffield-based Partnering to Reach Aspirations recently received tax-exempt status as the non-profit aims to transition recent graduates with mild Autism Spectrum Disorder from student life to independent living. An Amiel P. Zak Public Service Grant will provide educational opportunities to Suffield residents, educators and business leaders in order to better understand the strengths and needs of our young adults on the Spectrum.

"We want to encourage local businesses to work with us to provide these young adults opportunities to pursue their strengths and interests in an employment setting," explained the organizations director, Caroline Bissell d'Otreppe. "Currently, one out of every twenty-nine students in Suffield has been diagnosed as being On the Spectrum and it is by creating a supportive, accepting, and inspiring community around them that they are going to find their place and make the positive contributions they are capable of."

Aspirations will follow educational events for the general public with programs and opportunities for instruction in life/work skills development for our recent graduates with ASD. Underutilized space in town will be used until a permanent location for both residential and day programs is acquired. Fundraising events around the theme of A Town with Heart will serve as invitations to all Suffield residents to become involved in changing lives.

To kick-off this amazing endeavor, Aspirations will host a pop-up complimentary Refreshment Center at the Second Baptist Church on Main Street from mid-July to late August Monday through Friday, 2:00 to 5:00. Representatives from Partnering to Reach Aspirations and the Foundation for Exceptional Children of Suffield will be on-hand to share information about ASD as well as begin a dialogue about how the Town of Suffield can come together to support its talented ASD community.

"We hope you will stop by as you and your family come through town on a jog, walk, bicycle ride or while doing errands. We all deserve a break in our busy days," said d'Otreppe. "For our town and the ASD community, this can be life changing."

July Communion Offering Crossroads Food Pantry

Help to Alleviate Hunger in our Community!

The Communion offering in July is for the Cross-roads Food Pantry operated 100% by the volunteers of West Suffield Congregational Church (WSCC).

The mission of the Crossroads Food Pantry is to help alleviate hunger by providing food assistance (without restrictions or requirements) to nearby Connecticut residents.

Crossroads Food Pantry partners with Foodshare – the largest anti-hunger organization in the Greater Hartford area. Under this partnership, Foodshare charges WSCC only \$95 for each ton (2,000 lbs) of food that WSCC purchases for its food pantry in West Suffield! Put differently, Crossroads Food Pantry is able to buy 21 pounds of food (from Foodshare) for ony \$1.

This supply of discounted fresh and nutritious food can make the difference between hunger and health for the 80-100 families who are served by Crossroads every month - many of which include 3 or more children. This amounts to giving away about 3,000 pounds of food per month.

Every dollar you contribute to the July Communion Offering is so desparately needed. Your donation will go directly to helping WSCC supply food for our Connecticut neighbors who suffer daily from chronic hunger.


