

A Welcoming In Ministry

Sunday Flower Dedications....

You can help beautify our Sanctuary through the year by donating a live altar flower arrangement in honor

or memory of loved ones. It's simple to do:

- 1. Pick a date to sign up (Flower Calendar is outside Fellowship Hall or call the office to see if your date is open)
- Enter your name on the Flower Calendar on the date you want your flowers. (Someone will call a week ahead to find out who the flowers are in memory or honor of.)
- 3. You can order the flowers or give your check (minimum amount \$45) for the flowers to the church office prior to your date (a week notice and mark it for "Sunday flowers"). The Flower Committee will do the rest.
- 4. Your dedication will appear in the Sunday bulletin for the week your chose. (flowers in memory or honor can be a birthday, wedding, anniversary, birth, thank you to someone, or you just want to bring sunshine in the church.)

...Become Weekly Smiles

If you dedicate a flower arrangement or one has been dedicated to you, you are free to take the flowers home with you on Sunday after the worship service. However, if you leave them, we turn them into 3 or more smaller arrangements and deliver them to our church family to share a smile with them. Our flower ministry create these little bits of sunshine. Then we pick shut-in's or people home from a hospital stay and share a little bit of love with them. It's amazing how fresh flowers can brighten a day!

How You Can Help

Every year, we post a signup so you can pick a week to dedicate flowers. If you aren't able to manage the signup, just call the church office and we'll give you a hand. There are usually dates available throughout the year that no one has sponsored.

The Second Baptist Church of Suffield is a community of faith whose members strive to identify and help those in need. The members of the Missions ministry are grateful that through the generosity of our congregants, we have been able to support many local and international organizations throughout the year.

For the month of November, we have chosen a well-known local organization, the Suffield Community Aid, as the benefactor of our Communion Offerings.

SCA began in 1903 under the original title of the 'Emergency Aid Association'.

Today, 115 years later, they are still responding to the changing needs of Suffield residents by offering critical social services and enriched programming, particularly during periods of need. They strive to enhance the full potentials of all residents, and thereby, improve the overall quality of life in our community. Do these values and goals sound familiar?? J


Although SCA offers financial and program support in many areas, the SBC Missions ministry has chosen to directly support the Energy Assistance Program- specifically the Suffield Community Aid Private Fuel Bank, which provides fuel (oil, gas, electric, propane and wood) assistance to individuals and families in need. Priority is given to residents who do not qualify for other energy programs and whose health and safety is jeopardized by their inability to heat their home. The intent of these funds is to assist during crisis.

Oil and gas prices have risen almost 50% since the pandemic began 18 months ago. Anyone who has filled their car's tank recently has seen the dramatic increase of gas over the past few months. Heating home oil prices are expected to rise just as exponentially.

Donations will be collected each Sunday during the month of November. If giving online through the church PayPal account, please designate your donation to "Missions".
