#### A Note from Tom Carr:

I will be attending the American Baptist Churches, USA Biennial in Portland, Oregon to be held June 29<sup>th</sup> through July  $2^{nd}$ . The Biennial is a time to meet with American Baptists from around the country and the world, to pray, worship and discuss the important ministries of the Gospel with people of similar and different perspectives, and to be empowered to continue our congregational ministry in our local communities. I have two specific responsibilities at this year's gathering. One is to represent the American Baptist Creation Justice Network, a task force of the denomination whose vision is "A just and sustainable future for God's creation," with a mission "To build a movement among Baptists that seeks peace, justice and reconciliation with all of God's creation." Secondly, attendees of the Biennial will have an opportunity to experience a session of spiritual direction with one of dozens of certified spiritual directors present. I will meet with people throughout the gathering to walk with them for a very brief time on their spiritual journeys.

I'll be leaving Suffield on June 28<sup>th</sup> and returning on July 10<sup>th</sup>. While in the Pacific Northwest, I'll visit my son, Geoff, who lives in Seattle. During my absence, emergency pastoral care will be provided by local clergy.
