Three items for your reflection. The first is our upcoming 2020 Comments financial stewardship campaign. You'll read about this in another place in this month's Crier but I

want to add that every year at this time, we focus on our financial giving. We dream, both as a congregation and as individuals, for what we desire to realize in our personal and congregational life. We wrestle with these dreams and what is possible for ministry in our congregation and so we pray seeking wisdom about how we can best respond with our tithes and our pledges of financial support to the grace of God in our lives. For me, this is always an anxious and exciting time. Anxious because even though I know God is in the mix in all of this and when God is in the mix, there is nothing to fear, I still get a bit anxious. I wonder whether our financial pledges and promises will be enough to help make the dreams of our particular ministries come true. But mostly, I get excited because during this season, we listen to stories – stories of faith and hope, stories of struggles and challenges, stories of people pulling together to help our community to be faithful to the high calling of God in our lives and how God is at work in the midst of this world God so loves. The testimonies we hear during this time, particularly in Sunday worship, always inspire me; they are sermons in themselves, because they are gospel, Good News. I pray that during this time, you would reflect on what God has done and is doing in your life and throughout the world.

Secondly, it has been an invigorating start to the 2019-2020 program year. The renovations to the Kneece Chapel Common Room, more organizations and groups from the community using the building for their good work and activities, the special programs – and the regular ones – we are engaged in as a congregation, and the children and parents of the Pre-School Co-op in the building daily, has injected such a positive, wonderful energy for our congregational life and ministry.

I am grateful to be part of this ministry. I hope you will invite friends, neighbors, family and others to join us. Third, I share with you something by Dr. Paul Tournier:

> "Even the happiest life is a constant struggle to face the problems it raises, the external and internal conflicts it arouses, which are the very stuff of life itself; . . . 'It is much easier,' I read in a letter from one of my patients,' to be in the position of a victim than in that of a person conscious of her responsibilities and of the gifts she is endowed with. But it is the only way to inner maturity.' Then she adds: 'How difficult it is really to accept one's life as it is. But I know that everything comes back to that acceptance – and that is the real key to happiness.' ... acceptance of one's life has nothing to do with resignation; ... it means accepting it as it comes, with all the handicaps of heredity, of suffering . . . and injustices."

To consciously, willingly accept one's life as it is, is to know the presence of God.

Missions Update

At their September meeting, the Mission Committee voted to send \$1,500 to the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) for relief aid to the hurricane ravaged Bahamas. Hurricane Dorian destroyed so much of part of the islands and the needs are great, both in the short-term and long-term. OGHS is the ecumenical effort of Christian denominations designed to empower communities, provide water, supply food, alleviate poverty and respond to disasters around the world. American Baptists and other denominations have already sent tens of thousands of dollars to help our neighbors in the Bahamas. With this gift, and your continuing support of our concern for God's people everywhere, Second Baptist Church is playing a small and important part in caring for God's people in time of deep need.



This month, our Communion Offering will be designated to assist the American Baptist Churches, USA, World Mission Offering (WMO). WMO is dedicated to the comprehensive support of **International Ministries (IM)** initiatives. Perhaps most importantly, WMO donations provide essential funding for IM's global missionary servants who live and work overseas in places where there is the greatest need. By virtue of your WMO contributions IM can also enlist personnel here at home to provide essential support services for IM's global workers so they can serve productively in their host countries. WMO also sustains IM's ability to identify, select and evaluate reliable and reputable local groups (in the foreign mission field), for they are the ones "on the ground" to whom IM's missionaries turn for help and they are the ones to whom - so often - One Great Hour of Sharing emergency relief-aid can be entrusted. Participation of such indigenous groups is essential to the effectiveness of responsive vital projects (undertaken with IM's international partners) in times of global disasters.

Moreover, funding through the annual WMO initiative enables IM to leverage and energize many other valuable and diverse missional relationships with the likes of American Baptist Churches USA, American Baptist Home Mission Societies, Baptist World Alliance, All Africa Baptist Fellowship, Asia Pacific Baptist Federation, Baptist Women's Union of Latin America, Caribbean Baptist Fellowship and European Baptist Federation. The environments of trust and cooperation created in these special relationships serve greatly to magnify the ministry possibilities for each of our global workers.

In short, The World Mission Offering is critical to the international ministries of our larger American Baptist family. During the month of October, please prayerfully consider adding your financial support to this cause.
