Reflections from Rachael

posed by ABC Pastors and Christian Educators from around the country. Our first lesson is on Integrity. All adults are welcome!



World Mission Offering for October "We've been Surprised by God's Glory"

Beginning October 3 and through the month of October, the Communion Offering has been designated to the World Mission Offering – a national offering supporting American Baptist Churches International Ministries (IM) which includes 120+ global servants, 900+ volunteers, home staff, and 250+ international partners in 70 countries. Monies we donate when combined with donations from American Baptist Churches across the country bring economic development, theological education, health and wellness, and numerous other changes in people's lives all across the globe for the glory of God.

Although the pandemic had halted most travel for IM personnel during 2020 and early 2021 IM ministries continued throughout the world. Our global servants (missionaries) are working in their respective areas, home staff are developing new ways to improve training and provide support, projects are visualized and taking on lives of their own – all of which bring the good news of God's love and mercy.

In addition to financial support, we also ask that you pray for our global servants. A listing of IM global servants can be found on https://www.internationalministries.org/ international-ministries-global-servants. By selecting an individual (or couple) you can then get additional information regarding their individual ministry and mission as well as location of service. We challenge you to select a person(s) and pray for them and their ministry during the month of October.

In the past we (the church) have given generously to World Mission Offering as well as to Kristy Engel, a global consultant for IM (she has served with IM for over 21 years). We plan to give generously again this year, but we need your support!
