BLACK JACK

Rules of the game

Please take a seat in one of the empty boxes at the blackjack table – and let the fun begin!

ESSENTIALS OF THE GAME

Once all players have put up their stake in the boxes, two cards are dealt to each box and the croupier is dealt one card, face up. Starting with the box closest to the shoe and following round the table in order, every box owner may now ask for one or more additional cards until they believe that they are close enough to 21.

However, if the value of the player's cards exceeds 21, his stake and the cards are collected in by the croupier. Once the box owner in the last box has confirmed that he does not want any more cards by calling "stay" or "no more cards", the croupier must pick up a second card. He may even choose to pick up several.

Once the value of the croupier's cards has reached 17, he cannot pick up any more cards. If the value of the croupier's cards exceeds 21, all players left in the game have won. If the croupier does not go over 21, all players who have come closer to 21 than the croupier have won. If a player and the croupier have the same number of points, the round is declared a 'stand-off' or a draw and the player gets to keep his stake.



CARDS

Card values

Blackjack is played with 6 decks of 52 cards. One deck consists of 13 cards of each of four suits: hearts, clubs, diamonds and spades. The suit is irrelevant for the value of the cards.

- Aces count as either 1 or 11 points.
- Cards numbered 2 to 10 count at their face value.
- Every court card counts as 10 points.

Winnings

You double your stake (1:1) if the value of your cards does not exceed 21 and your cards score higher than those of the croupier. If you win with a blackjack, your winnings are paid out 3:2.



OUTCOMES AND KEY TERMINOLOGY



BLACK JACK

A player has a blackjack when his first two cards are worth **21**(an ace and a second card worth 10 points, e.g. a king).
A blackjack beats all other combinations of cards.

SPLITTING PAIRS

You can split your hand when the first two cards you are dealt have the same value, e.g. two 3's, or one queen and one jack. You continue playing with split hands, with two sepa-



rate stakes. You have the opportunity to split aces up to a maximum of 4 hands. You need to put up a new stake on each hand, equal to the amount of the original stake. You can request as many cards as you wish for these hands.

The exception to this rule is when splitting aces. You may only be dealt one extra card on each of the two split aces. If you have a combination of an ace and a court card (e.g. a jack at ten points), you have reached 21. However, 21 is not regarded as a blackjack in this case because it was not achieved with the first two cards dealt.

DOUBLING DOWN

Box owners have the chance to double their stakes after the first two cards have been dealt (including when these have been split). However, they are not allowed to double down if they have a blackjack. If players double down, they can only be dealt one more card. Back players can only double down if the box owner has doubled his stake.

INSURANCE

Insurance is a side stake that can be placed if the croupier's first card is an ace. If this is the case, players can insure against the possibility of a croupier blackjack with up to half the amount of their original stake. The insurance stake is placed on the 'insurance' area. If the croupier achieves a blackjack at the end of the deal, insurance is paid out 2 to 1, covering the stake that the player would otherwise have lost.

TRIPLE SEVEN

If a player's box is dealt three 7's, his bet is paid out at 1 to 1 immediately. The original stake remains for the rest of the round.

EVEN MONEY

If the croupier's first card is an ace and a player has a blackjack, the player can ask that his winnings be paid out immediately at 1 to 1, just in case the croupier also has a blackjack. (The standard blackjack payout is 3 to 2).



SIDE GAMES.

Perfect Pairs

The 'perfect pairs' side stake is based on the combination of the first two cards dealt to a box. Players can raise their stakes in units of 5 (€ or CHF). The minimum and maximum stakes are listed on the remaining layouts of a table.

Pairs

There are three different types of pairs in the 'perfect pairs' side bet. These different pairs are also paid out with different odds:

"Mixed Pair"

A pair of cards of the same number, one black and one red.



"Coloured Pair"

A pair of cards of the same number, both black or both red, but from different suits.



"Perfect Pair"

A pair of identical cards.



PAYOUTS

Mixed Pair 6:1 Coloured Pair 12:1 Perfect Pair 25:1

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Casino's experienced staff are responsible for ensuring that players observe the current rules of play. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to ask the Duty Manager. It is an international custom to leave a small part of your winnings – as much as you feel is appropriate – for the casino staff.
