

SUMMER NEWSLETTER 2020

We, the Trustees, Staff and Pupils at COGS, would like to begin by saying that we sincerely hope this newsletter finds you and all your family safe and well.

Over the last 6 months, throughout the world everyone has been experiencing a range of different situations, many that none of us have ever experienced before. Of course, COGS Nursery School in Gambia has been no different. All schools went into lockdown in the middle of March and at the time of writing this newsletter they remain closed.

Pa and Nina were in Gambia when the lockdown was first imposed in Gambia, which was just before the lockdown in the UK. This, of course was a very worrying time for everyone. They had 48 hours of uncertainty as to how and when they would get back to the UK. The Gambia immediately closed its borders and the airport except for any medical and food supplies that were coming in. The British Embassy in Gambia worked together with the Tour Operators and arranged their repatriation flights back to the UK. During this time, they went through a range of emotions from yes, they really wanted to get back to their family in the UK... to... they did not want to leave their family and friends in Gambia. Throughout, their time away, they were extremely fortunately to be kept fully informed by their Travel Agent, Liz from Travel Counsellors.

Despite, all the uncertainty over the last 6 months, we have stayed in regular contact with our team in Gambia and we are delighted to say everyone is keeping safe and well.

As many of you know, Nina's work is within the Education Sector and training is a large part of her job role. Every time she visits the Gambia, she always conducts School wide training, enabling those that attend, the opportunity to develop their knowledge and skills. Generally, her training focuses on aspects associated with education including Classroom Behaviour Management, the Importance of Play, How to Communicate Effectively as well how to Be Creative with Resources readily available.

Nina reported, "When we arrived in Gambia at the beginning of March, it was at the time Coronavirus was in the early stages of being diagnosed in patients in the UK but had not arrived in Gambia. As we know this situation quickly changed."



"As a group of Trustees, we had already decided that it was important to train the staff, children, families and communicates on 'How to Wash Your Hands Correctly'.

I explained as part of my training, this was to stop cross infection and it was going to be an important skill to know, not only with the current Pandemic but also to stop any infections being passed on.



I lost count of the number of people I ended up training, but in excess of 300 and that included staff from local hotels too. As part of the training, we were able to donate a bar



of soap to everyone who attended, which was down to the amazing support from you our donators, so Thank You!

As part of the schoolwide training, I also implemented a new hand washing procedure at the Nursery, and we purchased water barrels with taps added. During the training, I also explained about social distancing and at the time of writing this newsletter, the school is being prepared so social distancing can take place."



During her visit, all the children and staff were presented with their own personalised cup. Again, this will help massively with the stop of cross infection. It is the aim of COGS, that all children will receive their own personalised water bottle, which they will be able to take to and from school. This will help keep the children hydrated on their journey to school. Many of children do not live in the immediate vicinity of the Nursery and therefore




walk a considerable way.

We are pleased to report that, Mr Joof, School Coordinator, has settled well into his

position at COGS Nursery School and has already shown to be a real asset. With over 25 years of teaching and education experience, he is supporting Simon and his team. Part of his duties with Simon include, carrying out lesson observations, allowing staff training to be focused on the teacher's individual needs, supporting the teaching staff with their planning, as well as ensuring the Quality Improvement/Development Plan (QIDP) is implemented and actioned.

COGS developed their QIPD in line with the Department of Education Guidelines and as well as including school actions it also has links to development within the community of Jabang. On behalf of COGS




Trustees and the Team in Gambia, we welcome Mr Joof to our COGS family.



A Kangaroo by Hannah – Age 8


