Andrew Gurney story continues These are skills they learnt in Tornado Youth?

Yes, not that they learned how to play but they learned that there is something better out there for you. They got out of Tornado and went to another church or whatever and I then found out they were playing in a band there.

I wonder if learning how to be a group member of Tornado Youth, learning those skills of being part of a group and a community has translated to them being part of a band, part of another group? 100%. 100%.

You started off [youth groups] in Kamo, are you able to remember how you got started?

Same way as Tornado Youth. I just went to all of the businesses and asked the businesses if they would finance running something for the young people. They had a problem where businesses were getting broken into and graffiti and all sorts. So, they were only too willing to help. We had over 100 kids per week at that one.

The children, what age range were they?

Intermediate, so 12 years old up to teenagers but when they got too old, they liked it so much that they stayed and ended up being junior leaders. You can imagine with 70 kids that one person can't run it.

How did you run it?

Three other men came in and started. I was always the kingpin which looking back now I regret. I was the kingpin and the others just followed me. They knew what had to be done and got on and did it. We held a lot of big fundraising events in the community for Hikurangi. Community events, we had a trolley derby race down the hill in Hikurangi and the whole town came out for that.

We also held auctions. With the money we took the kids away to the snow once per year and they didn't have to pay anything as they didn't have anything, so we raised it by having auctions.

When you say snow, where was that?

Tongariro. We would take them away for 4 days of fun. Some of these kids never got out of Whangarei. We would just hire 3 vans and away we go.

Going back to what you said about 'the vision' what is the history of this skill of working with youth or interest with working with youth?

My relationship with God. He is the one that motivated me.

As a teen yourself how did you get into being a member of a youth group?

My mum and dad used to go to church and the church had a youth group and I just followed and joined in.

But we did so many other things for the community, we had a fashion week. Kids came and it was like a concert. All the parents would come along, and we would fit as many people as possible in the Hikurangi hall for kids to come along in clothes they had made.

What sorts of things did they make?

Dresses and different clothes that they wore. Some of them sang. It was like a talent quiz. We had judges and a big dinner. It was fantastic!

Was there anyone in particular that introduced you to this way of being, this vision around young people?

There were numerous people, especially from other churches. I'm saying this and trying to be humble. It takes a special person to do what we did. Nobody can do it unless they've been gifted to do it. I mean anyone can run a few games, but our things were never the same. We would do things radical, crazy. You can't do that sort of thing, but we did it.

What sort of radical things?

I can't remember now...I just remember one of my leaders saying to me 'we cant do that, it is crazy'. But we did it and the kids loved it. They looked forward to it every week, what's going to happen this week?

Ah so they never knew what was on the schedule?

No, they would turn up on the night and they'd be...yeah.

HIKURANGI VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE

Hi Hikurangi

As it starts to get colder, we remind everyone of winter fire safety. Make sure you have had your chimney swept, always use a fire guard with an open fire. Put all ashes in a metal bucket and pour water over the bucket, ashes can remain hot for 5 days.

Have your electric blanket checked by a qualified electrician, make sure that it lays flat on the bed, that the cords and controls are not twisted. Remember the heater metre rule, keep a clear metre around fireplaces and heaters, do not cover or store things on top of them. Cleaned the lint filter in your dryer recently? Dryer filters need to be cleaned out often.

Our Sky Tower Team all successfully completed their climb. 51 flights of stairs in full firefighting gear. Racing the clock against over 1100 firefighters from around the country. Emma did it in 24.46 Minutes – finishing 4th in the Masters Donned. Julie did it in 18.50 Minutes – Finishing 8th in the Female Open Donned. Hayden did it in 16.53 Minutes – Finishing 86th in the Male Open Donned and Started. Shar Did it in 19.34 Minutes – Fin-ishing 9th in the Female Open Donned.

Tēnā koutou katoa,

As I sit in my office typing this bulletin, outside/ki waho is wet and windy. Yes, I've come in on my day off, actually, I've got this coming week off, so by the time this gets read I'll be back at work. One of the benefits of Policing is that we manage to get a bit of leave and with my circumstances, it was a case of either I book some leave for the time I want or the power's that be will book some for me.

Great news for myself, well I'm particularly stoked with it, as of 2 weeks ago I signed a permanent Policing appointment for the Hikurangi area, so I'm here for as long as I can remain in this position. They have advertised a second position, permanent as well, but as knowing when it gets filled, I have no idea!

knowing when it gets filled, I have no idea! There's a plan in place for the Hikurangi Police Station and the house, at the moment, it's early stages, but sounding promising. Re-build/renovation of the house to become the 'Hub' station for Whangarei's 3 community stations. When this starts, I have no idea, but it has been put forward and recommended. What it will look like in the future, more general staff and traffic staff in the area. Time will tell.

Great sport on over the weekend, not only on tv with the Warrior's finding their game and the Blues going into the semi's, but our own tamariki. Every other Rāhoroi/Saturday you'll find me down at the Kensington sports grounds supporting my own kotiro's/girl's and nephew.

Burglaries – still a number getting reported. Again security, vigilance, sometimes it's unavoidable and the offender's will, if they see something they want won't stop or be put off by security features.

Wilful Damage – particularly, my station letterbox which was set alight, on fire. burnt. I'm still waiting for those 2 young persons to come see me to sort it out, got to give a shout out to the cctv cameras.

Shoplifting – from the local 4 Square, Avi the owner has had several people unfortunately walking out without paying for the items they've taken off the shelves. Unfortunately, some of them have been local and some from out of town. If your local, you will be trespassed, meaning for 2 years you are not allowed to step foot in the premises.

Just for everyone, its hard being a business owner especially when your losing stock/product. All the local business owner's in Hikurangi do a great job and put generously back into the community so please look after them.

Rāmere po/Friday nights from 4pm, held at the Hikurangi School is the Pūmanawa Awhina/Community Connect, rangatahi activation which runs for approximately 2hrs. They provide round robin of games, turbo touch, volleyball, tag, 3 on 3 basketball and other games with free sausage sizzle, no limit on the number of sausages you can eat. If your young kotiro or tama is wanting to burn a bit more energy, for the next 4 weeks from 4pm on Friday's come down to the Hikurangi School, all welcome. Parents can join in on the games as well.

Lastly with the weather conditions the way they are, please drive to survive, drive to the conditions, and make it home.

For now, that's about all, I'll see everyone around on my return, stay safe out there, take care and look after each other. Feel free to drop in and see me with any concerns or if, wanting advice. The catch, if my ute is in the driveway, I'm here otherwise I'm not working or I'm out and about.

HIKURANGI HISTORICAL MUSEUM



In April 1930 several young people were killed in one of the worst railway level crossing accidents in the history of New Zealand. A bus coming from Hikurangi going to the pictures in Whangarei was struck by a train on "Mc Leod's Crossing". The bus was hurled some distance and sadly there were many casualties. The picture shows the funeral procession going through Hikurangi with the coffins of the victims laid out on the open back of trucks. Residents of Hikurangi are standing and watching on the footpath.

On June 28 we celebrate Matariki. A big part of it is to acknowledge those who have passed and to release their spirits to become stars. We will have a stall in the War Memorial Hall on this day where we present some more information about the meaning of Matariki and the history of our village.
