Tēnā koutou katoa,

Ko te tumanako kei te ora koe. (I hope you are doing well). Christmas is nearly here and the end and start of another year. Schools are nearly all done, our tamariki will be harikoa/happy. Parents will be pulling their hair out shortly. What a year it has been. I've been working in Hikurangi area for one year and so far have I enjoyed it. I've still got a long way to go to cement myself properly in this area but for now I have time on my

side. Slow is Fast as they say in the military. We have lost Josh. (He was the bad cop, I'm the good cop). I won't have a mate until March, April 2024 when Police advertise Josh's position. From the sounds of things, they will be advertising it as a permanent position, which is great, so watch this space. I don't think there is going to be any issues with applicants, I've had a few people whispering in my ear and wanting to apply. As we are all aware this job really needs two Police Officers working here.

Josh spoke about executing warrants on vehicle's doing burn outs in last month bulletin, I can confirm we impounded the vehicles that were involved, hopefully this sends some sort of message out. Unfortunately, there are areas that are not monitored by cctv cameras which are used for this type of activity. For those that are having issues with this behaviour please report it, call 111 or report via 105, if your able to get any clear footage, recordings and noted registration plates, Police would appreciate this.

With people being away over this summer period, houses vacant etc, please be vigilant, secure your property and keep a kanohi/eye out on your neighbour's property. If you see something suspicious, take some details of what you're seeing i.e., registration plates, description of person/s and give us a call so we can follow up. It may be nothing or it may be the call that stops further activity from this person or person's.

Again, apologises for anyone who comes to the Hikurangi Station finding it unmanned, if its important, call 111, if you're trying to get a hold of me call 105 and leave a message with the call taker, they will or often will send a email to me and I'll pick it up when I'm back on duty or when I open the email and read it.

For those of you that are lucky enough to have time off over the coming summer break, this summer is looking like a scorcher so hit those beaches, enjoy our backyard playgrounds, and keep the whanau safe throughout. Don't forget, Slip Slop and Slap on a potae, be waterwise, drive to the conditions, get to wherever you're travelling to safe. if It take's an extra hour, so be

In the last 3 weeks I've attended 2 motor vehicle crashes ending with 3 fatalities. I can't reiterate this enough, drive to the conditions. Let's make it home!

If you're working through, I'm feeling you, I'll be around Christmas day and boxing day, hopefully be able to sneak home for a kai in between. I'll be in and out over the New Year. There will be extra staff working the coastal areas and road Policing units patrolling the highways.

If anyone knows of anyone struggling over this period reach out, I have some food boxes here that I'm more than happy to provide and any other assistance we can offer I can look in to it.

For now, kia tupato, stay safe out there, take care and look after each other.





HIKURANGI HISTORICAL MUSEUM



Henry Samuel Taylor (Bull Taylor) 1923-2009

Henry and his four younger brothers grew up on a farm in Peats Rd, Kaurihohore. Being five boys they got up to a considerable amount of mischief. Their mother often got phone calls beginning Mrs Taylor your boys are....... All five played rugby for Hikurangi, Henry, Gordon, Bruce, Donald and Stuart all feature in the museums collection of sporting photos. Henry played both Prop and Hooker and admitted to being one

of the bad boys, if someone hit him he whacked them back. I believe on more that one occasion he wore an opposition sock, handy in the scrum. Henry disliked farming with a passion and as soon as he could he joined the Air Force and spent 'his war' in the pacific mainly in Fiji and also Guadal Canal. He was in the beaching party for the Catalina Flying Boats. On his return he worked at the Brickworks in Kamo. Henry then joined the Army and went to Japan as part of a J Force. While in Japan he was in the 2nd NZEF Rugby team that won the Duntroom Cup in 1948, beating an Australian side. Back from Japan he headed to the South Island and worked on the Hydro Dams at Lake Pukaki and Lake Tekapo. While there he played rugby for the Geraldine Rugby Club. Henry then settled with his wife Betty, in Hikurangi and worked in both the Hikurangi and Kamo mines until their closure. Henry then worked for the Whangarei Council County as a grader driver until he retired aged 60. He joined the Hikurangi Volunteer Fire Brigade and rose up the ranks and became Fire Chief. He received his Gold Star in 1985 and retired from the Brigade reluctantly aged 65. The Taylor family lived in View Rd and although the section was on a hill it was flat because as I have mentioned Henry had a grader. His idea of gardening was everything at ground level. In the early 1970's a new road was formed that ran behind a group of houses in View Rd, back yards became front yards. Some people adapted but not Henry, his back yard remained his back yard despite hints from the council that he should tidy things up. Grader blade tips made good reinforcing in concrete, another of Henry's gardening favourites. Sometime in the 1980's Telecom were installing new underground cables and came to an abrupt halt when they encountered Henry's concrete. Henry when in his 70's along with his brother Bruce, caretaker at Kaurihohore Cemetery, made a decision to repair the flagpole in the RSA section. An incident occurred and the flagpole knocked Henry to the ground. An ambulance was called and on arrival at hospital Henry soon became the butt of many jokes for cutting down a flagpole. Henry made his final journey from Hikurangi May 6th 2009 on the back of a 1980 Jeep borrowed from the Ngunguru Fire Brigade. He is buried in the RSA section of the Kaurihohore Cemetery. A fitting place for him as his family farm adjoined the cemetery.

Henry's granddaughter was dating a young man whose mother grew up at Kaurihohore and was asked if she was one of those "Mad Taylor's from Kaurihohore". She proudly responded "Yes I am".

THE HIKURANGI CASES AUCKLAND, Nov. 25


At the Supreme Court, the lad named Charles Berry Simons, found guilty in connection with the opening of a love letter in the post office at Hikurangi, was brought up for sentence.

Judge Edwards said that the dis-. . closing of private correspondence in this way was a very serious offence. He could not at present see his way to do anything but inflict severe punishment, but he would take further time to consider the matter.

William Henderson, another lad found guilty of destroying circulars sent through the post and not claimed, was ordered to come up for sentence when called upon and to pay £12 towards the costs of the prosecution.

Sentence on Joel Rowley for having opened a letter at the Hikurangi post cffice was deferred.
