For you, what attributes and skills did you draw upon to become a leader?

Doing dumb things, definitely that. I would just dream, dream, dream and I'd come up with silly things to do. I'd always

have to raise money and go around to businesses and hold auctions so that the kids could do these things as I knew the parents couldn't afford to do

These things of 'dumb things' and 'silly things' how did that feature in your life...where did you learn that?

Just by dreaming. I would lie in bed each night and think 'what am I going to do next week?' It would just come to me.

I remember one programme that I wanted to do but we couldn't afford to do it as it was going to cost a hundred bucks which back then we just couldn't afford. We were having a meeting and a guy just knocked on the window and said, 'are you Tornado?'. I said 'yes', and he gave me \$20 towards the programme and that was how things happened.

So, Tornado Youth was about community? 100%.

Once a year we would do over a house, we would raise money and do someone's house up. Do over the gardens and put fences up and all sorts. We did it all in one day. I'm talking about the whole section made over, replanting, put fences up, put decks up on the houses, painted, painted the roof.

painted, painted the roof. And if a member of the 'Tornado Youth' group was sitting here now and I asked them to tell me just one thing they appreciated about what you have done in your time leading the youth group, what do you think they would say? Awesome!

At the end of our conversation Andrew asked if we may sign off with the following:

'To the Glory of God' For you Andrew, having that signature at the end, what does that mean?

It means, it's not about me. I'm just the person that floowed instructions from the big guy upstairs.

HIKURANGI VOLUNTEER FIRE BRIGADE

Hi Hikurangi

We recently hit 100 calls for the year, averaging 16 calls per months. With a large range of calls, Car fires and Vegetation fires the highest type of calls so far this year. Check out our Facebook page for the breakdown of the calls so far.

With so much constantly changing weather lately remember to drive to the conditions, frosty mornings can potentially leave us with icy roads. Constant rainy days leave our roads slippery, care is required in all conditions on the road.

Make sure you have had your chimney swept, always use a fire guard with an open fire. Put all ashes in a metal bucket and pour water over the bucket, ashes can remain hot for 5 days.

Have your electric blanket checked by a qualified electrician, make sure that it lays flat on the bed, that the cords and controls are not twisted.

Remember the heater metre rule, keep a clear metre around fireplaces and heaters, do not cover or store things on top of them.



HIKURANGI HISTORICAL MUSEUM



Featured in our current Decorative Arts exhibit is a selection of four women's hats. These were donated from the Maud Rickard collection and include a wooden hat stand from the same source.

All hats are festooned in swathes of fabric and decorated with trimmings of ribbon loops, bows or feather. The maroon velvet bonnet particularly catches the eye with wide ribbons to be tied in a jaunty bow under the chin.

Wooden hat stands were often part of a domestic household. Used by both milliners and women at home to create or update hats by renewing the trimming.

to create or update hats by renewing the trimming. The importance of a hat in a woman's wardrobe cannot be underestimated. Offering more than protection from the elements, hat wearing may express personality, convey social prestige and contribute to a well groomed appearance.

The Northern Advocate article of August 1893 offers guidelines in matters of dress. In this season headgear may be of personal taste and still be in fashion. Bonnets are now small, leghorn straw is in favour and trims of black roses are one of the latest novelties.

Ornamental hat pins secured hats that sat on the back of the head, of which the museum boasts a fine collection.

Hikurangi women were well supported in this pursuit. The Northern Advocate of October 1890 advertises a new drapery opening opposite the Settlers Hotel in Whangarei. Mr Turley intends to sell at less than Auckland prices. He brings with him the service of a first class milliner (Miss Reid) and a full stock of the latest styles of hats and trimmings.

The Whangarei opening of Millinery and Ladies Underclothing Establishment by Miss Allender (late of Auckland) in 1890 offers retrimming of hats and bonnets

The connection from Auckland in both cases seems to assure quality of style and service.

News from the fashion capitals in Europe like Paris influenced hat styles. Then as World War 1 loomed, the over sized and richly embellished hats of the early 1900's gave way to more modest and plainer styles in keeping with more sobering times.
