



Hi Hikurangi We are prepping for the next cyclone to hit. We would like to remind everyone its important to have plans in place. Have you enough supplies if your stuck at home? Are you prepared if you can't get home? Do you have a battery powered radio? A way to charge your phone? Torches & batteries if the power goes out? Check out the Civil Defence's website for tips on preparing for such

events. Keep in contact with family and friends that may be in those high flood risk areas.

Please take care in the weather, only go out if its essential, watch for fallen debris on the roads, treat all fallen powerlines as live, and don't drive through floodwater. Call 111 in an emergency. We will always give top priority to calls where life and safety is at risk We are here when you need us.

The Hikurangi Auto Madness Team have planning underway, we will be there with the trucks on display we will also be manning the BBQ again. Have you got smoke alarms installed? This is a vital tool in your home safety kit. When you're asleep, you lose your sense of smell, so make sure its in working order. Test it once a month, also give it a vacuum now and again, dust build up can trigger the smoke alarm to sound vacuuming the smoke alarm will prevent false alarms.





#### **HIKURANGI HISTORICAL MUSEUM**



A local branch of the 'Dominion's Women's Institutes' started in Hikurangi in May 1929 (Later known as the NZ Country Women's Institutes aka: CWI). The motto for the CWI was 'For Home and Country'. The CWI intended to increase

opportunities and activities available to rural women; developing the 'intellectual, cultural and spiritual potential of both the individual and society'. Each CWI meeting was organised around a demonstration, sharing, discussion and competitions. CWI members were heavily engaged in their community; raising money by making and selling items, running dances and organising donated goods/ clothing drives. They sent these funds and items to soldiers serving overseas, refugee communities, orphanages, the

Red Cross and local health camps. The Hikurangi branch started with 14 members and had increased to nearly 80 by July 1931. Popularity of the CWI grew in NZ during the Great Depression, most likely because of the emphasis on sharing knowledge, whilst practicing thrift and self-sufficiency. Members shared tips on what to do with stale bread; competitions were held to see who could make the best article from a flour or sugar bag, best baking without sugar, or best egg-less cake. The popularity of the CWI is evident in the number of other branches operating at the same time in the wider Hikurangi district: Helena Bay, Riponui/ Jordan, Opuawhanga, Maromaku, Whakapara, Otonga, and Marua. The Hikurangi branch met monthly. They saw themselves as non-sectarian, non- political, and existing solely for social good. In 1947 they raised enough funds to commission a monument for the school in commemoration of nine soldiers who lost their lives during in the second-world war. All nine were once children who attended the Hikurangi school. Remember, over the Summer period the Museum is trialling longer opening hours: 10 - 1pm (Saturdays only). Also, the Hikurangi Museum renovation project begins Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> Feb. There will be working bees every Saturday up until 25<sup>th</sup> March; including some Tues and Thurs evenings. Please get in contact with the museum either through email, Facebook, or visit us to register your interest in helping.
