Over the last few months there has been a lot happening at the school. COGS staff, together with two teachers from Jabang Lower Basic School attended a one day First Aid training. The training was delivered by Lainey on behalf of First Aid for Gambia. The team learnt many new skills including CPR, the recovery position, how to manage bleeding, burns, breaks and sprains. Having basic lifesaving/first aid skills is so important as none of us know when a medical emergency may take place. This training is only possible due to the donations and support from you.

When asked about the day, Raymond Jabang, Teacher said, "I learnt a lot today and I am appreciative to everyone in the UK for their help and support. Thank you."

**Whilst** in Gambia, Pa and I had the great opportunity of joining in the community Independence celebrations when we visited each compound (house) to celebrate with the children's families. The children were dressed in their traditional costumes and for their lunch, they had the typical food from their tribe. A great tradition for the girls is to have sweets tied in their hair

braids as well as having sashes made of biscuits - which you can see in this picture. I have to say they were very restrained and didn't eat any of the sweets or biscuits until lunchtime. I tried on numerous occasions to persuade them otherwise, but they were having none of it!

**It's** always such a delight to join the classes and sit with the children

during the school morning. I was able to join in the fun and frolics of singing action rhymes with Nursery 1, who thought it was very funny that I knew the words to 'Peter Hammer'. But instead of singing about Peter, we were singing the Gambian version - 'Lamin Hammers'



I also played 'mummies and daddies'...This took me back to when I was doing my degree and my dissertation. At the time, my research focussed on 'is Imaginative Play beneficial in the Nursery Classroom.' I wrote 15,000 words on this, when in fact I could have answered it in just one word.... **YES**. Even 20 years later, I would still say the answer is yes!

On my next visit to the nursery in December, I will have the pleasure of training not only COGS staff, but staff from other local Nursery and Lower Basic schools on Classroom Management & Differentiation and Safeguarding. This will also incorporate 'Makaton' which for anyone who doesn't know is a worldwide recognised communication tool which enables individuals to communicate who may otherwise struggle for a range of reasons.

This will allow our parents, pupils and teachers to effectively communicate with each other no matter what life challenges they face.
