Over the last year we have all experienced many challenges, had to make adaptions to working practices, been unable to visit and see family and friends and juggled home schooling with all other aspects of family life. Just like us here in the UK, our team in Gambia have also faced a range of different challenges.

After 11 years the water supply to the school and local community stopped working. Upon further investigation it transpired the water pump was completely embedded in the hole meaning it was unable to pump the water which left only one option.... a new borehole was needed.

Thankfully, due to all the amazing orders and donations **COGS** received for the face masks it enabled us to use the £1,500 raised to replace the borehole.

Of course, it is impossible to manage without an efficient water supply but our amazing maintenance team in Gambia which is led by Sam Sanyang were mobilised into



action and the borehole was replaced. Our thanks go to Sam and the team in Gambia for their quick response.

Like here, we continued to ensure all new Covid-19 protocols that have been introduced in response to the pandemic have continued at the nursery school. This includes social distancing, with washing and sanitising hands on a regular basis. Simon has informed me that the children have adapted to the 'new normal' well, and the processes implemented now are just second nature to them, which is great to hear.

Sadly, we said goodbye to our Pre-Nursery Teacher Adama who has decided to move onto pastures new taking on a new teaching role at a Lower Basic School. We are in the process of recruiting a teacher to continue the good work that Adama has done. When Adama came to us she wanted to be a teacher but did not have the formal teaching qualification. At **COGS** we are keen to support enthusiastic and dedicated individuals. We supported and paid for Adama to undertake her three years teacher training. By studying this it allowed her to gain her Early Childhood Development qualification. We wish Adama all the best in her new role and thank her for her contribution to **COGS** Nursery School over the 5 years she was employed at the nursery school.

The children are enjoying their creative lessons which include, drawing, painting, hand printing and



To enable the children to catch up on some of the schooling they have missed, the Ministry of Education have confirmed schools are to stay open until 13th August and will not be closing now which is what they would normal have done.

Sadly, due to the pandemic the decision has been made to postpone the summer outing for the children again this year. However, rest assured they will not miss out on this. The children who graduated both last year and this year to the Lower Basic school will be invited to attend an outing when the pandemic situation has improved, and it is safer for them to visit the attraction they choose to go to as well as having their annual visit to the beach.
